LITURGY CORNER: THE REVISED ROMAN MISSAL: **When will the revised Missal be available in Canada?** The English translation of the third edition of the *Roman Missal* needs to serve all English-speaking people in the Roman Catholic Church. Because so many countries are involved, this is a complicated procedure and takes a great deal of time.

On September 3, 2010, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops received *recognitio* (approval) from the Congregation for Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments (the department at the Vatican for the standard texts of the *Roman Missal* that will be used by all the other English-speaking countries, and has recently received *recognitio* for some adaptations specific to Canada. The date for the implementation of the revised Roman Missal in Canada has been set for the **First Sunday of Advent, which will be November 27, 2011.**

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST JUNE 26, 2011

REFLECTION:

FIRST READING: *Deuteronomy 8.2-3, 14-16*

God fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know.

This reading is part of the address Moses spoke to the Israelites at the end of their 40-year sojourn in the desert, just before they crossed the Jordan into the land of promise. Moses reminds them of what they have been through during these years; but his focus is on the miraculous way in which God provided for them, raining down manna in the desert, bringing forth water from the rock. Manna, the "food unknown to you and your fathers" is the emblem of the Eucharist, the true food that is given for eternal life.

SECOND READING: *1 Corinthians 10.16-17*

Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body.

We hear Paul's exhortation to the divided Corinthian community. The economic and political divisions among them have crept into their celebrations of Eucharist, but Saint Paul tells them that this must not be: for the Eucharist is not just a meal, but a "participation," a sharing, in the Body and Blood of the Lord. And because he is one, we are also one body. The Eucharist is our communion with the Lord and each other.

GOSPEL: *John 6.51-59*

My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink.

In the First Reading, the manna is compared to the word of God, by which we live. But Jesus speaks here not just of his word, but of his flesh, as the life of the world. The people "quarreled among themselves." Jesus does not back down or soften his language. Instead, he says even more insistently that his flesh and blood are the source of life; they are true food that nourishes us for eternal life.
